GUIDELINES FOR ITPEDIA ARTICLES

If you want to participate in ITpedia as an author, you can. However, ITpedia does state a number of conditions to the articles before they are included. Therefore, keep the following in mind:

- 1. Write legible language. Dutch and English are allowed.
- 2. Offensive articles will be refused. No violence, no sex, no name-calling.
- 3. Articles that clearly advertise a company, product, or service are refused. Explanation about products and services is allowed if they are informative.
- 4. The article contains 750 3000 words. Cut an article that is too large into several articles.
- 5. Write neuter. ITpedia is an encyclopedia, not a blog. So no adventures with yourself as the main character.
- 6. Keep it factual, no guesses, lies, or half-truths. Be informative.
- 7. Keep it general, not for a specific organization, but applicable to everyone.
- 8. Legal photos, diagrams, and other materials are most welcome. They serve outside the document in the same email to be delivered.
- 9. Copyright. Don't plagiarize, be original. If you include texts from others in your article record, cite the source.

BENEFITS FOR AUTHORS

- 1. The author gets his own page on which he/she can introduce himself. Provide a short text. Possibly with website and accessibility information.
- 2. The name of the author is mentioned in the article with a link to the author's page.
- 3. 1 external link is allowed in the article.
- 4. The article may be an extensive summary of an article on your own website referenced by a link.
- 5. Thanks to the large number of visitors to ITpedia, a topic gets more attention than on company websites. So, an article on ITpedia can be used as a landing page for a topic.
